Eph. 5:31-32 provides us easy-to-remember teaching on right, Jesus-centered priorities to guide and bless ALL of life, esp. as we pass on saving faith to our family and the world under the grace and power of Jesus and His church.

Dr. Biermann (married to Heather Stange of Frankenmuth, MI in 1995) has always had a passion for fostering marriages and families in God's way. This has been true in his role as a parish pastor of the LCMS for 33 years (most recently at Faith Lutheran, Grand Blanc, MI), in his international ministry with Heather, *Life in God's Way*, and now as they both are working with *Concordia Center for the Family (CCF)* out of Ann Arbor, MI. Dr. Biermann's educational path (BA at Concordia University Nebraska, MDiv at Concordia Seminary St. Louis and DMin at Concordia Theological Seminary Fort Wayne) along with a wide array of speaking, teaching and field experience has prepared him for his role as the Executive Director of CCF, which he was called to begin in February 2024. He has won the Concordia Nebraska Outstanding Student Teacher Award, the Milwaukee Lutheran HS/Heartland Funds Teacher of Merit Award, the South Wisconsin District Teacher of the Year Award, and the CUW Master Educator Award. Besides speaking nationally in 25 states, Brad has two books: *Life's Big Questions, God's Big Answers* and *Starting at the End*. Dr. Beverly Yahnke

A Parents' Guide to Understanding and Responding to Post-Christian Sexuality This presentation will provide a fast-moving overview of significant ways in which our post-Christian culture has attacked our children's understanding of traditional Christian sexuality. Parents will be invited to review the specific temptations, threats and tools used by the culture to confuse children with toxic impressions about gender and sex. Dr. Yahnke will offer recommendations for parents and grandparents to respond to such situations with confidence at home and within the context of our children's schools.

Dr. Beverly Yahnke is a clinical psychologist serving as the Executive Director of Christian Counsel for DOXOLOGY. During her 25 years in private clinical practice, she provided care for church workers and their families. She has also served as Department Chair and Professor of Psychology at Concordia University Wisconsin where she was named "Faculty Laureate". Most recently, her work with DOXOLOGY has focused on providing pastors, teachers, and church workers with opportunities for renewal and advanced training. Dr. Yahnke has written numerous articles about psychology, education and faith, and is a frequently invited speaker for clergy and educator conferences. Concordia Theological Seminary, where she serves on the Board of Regents, awarded her with an honorary doctorate in recognition of her service to the church.



Mike Zimmer

Time to Mourn; Time to Dance

How does the joy of the Gospel help the Christian navigate the horrors of grief? This session will survey the wounds of broken dreams and give participants practical tips of "do's and don'ts" when you or those around you are faced with tragic loss.

Mike Zimmer retired in 2022 after 40 years of service to the LCMS as a Commissioned Minister. He served as teacher, administrator, congregational consultant, and district executive in education. He is

married to a retired Lutheran teacher (Jenifer). They have two daughters (Amanda and Stephanie) who also serve as Commissioned Ministers. They have six grandchildren on this side of Heaven.

In 2000 Mike and Jeni's son, Jacob, was killed in a car accident. In 2018 they had two unborn grandchildren who passed away. Years of searching Scriptures, attending "grief groups", counseling and reading lots of books on grief, gives Mike unique insights on how the Christian can deal with personal tragedy while clinging to the assurance of eternal life.
